

Q1 Are you currently taking any prescription medication?





Q2 Have you ever wanted to take a medication that hasn't been approved for sale in your province?





Q3 Taking into consideration any insurance coverage you may have, how much financial strain do you experience from purchasing any medication you are currently prescribed?









Q6 Of the medications you are currently taking please think about the medication that you have been taking longest. How long have you been taking that medication?







Q8 On the previous question, you indicated that you have some type of insurance that covers some or all of your drug costs. Who provides your insurance?





Q9 Have you ever wanted to take a drug that wasn't covered under your plan?





Q10 Have you ever been prescribed a medication by your doctor that it is not covered by your insurance?





Q11 When you pick up prescriptions do you ever pay anything out-of-pocket at the pharmacy (i.e. does your plan have a co-pay and/or deductible)?











Q20 In the last two years, have you received a prescription from your doctor that you left unfilled?









Q23 In the past two years, how many prescriptions have you left unfilled due to cost?





Q24 Discussions about the high costs of drugs in Canada have led some people to advocate for a national pharmacare plan as part of the solution. A recent research study by St. Michael's Hospital in Toronto looked at the effect of a very basic plan that covered only a list of 117 "essential" drugs. Their study found that this coverage would cost \$1.23 billion per year, but would save Canadians \$4.27 billion per year. Those savings come from a reduction in spending on drug plans by employers and unions, and from savings for families that don't have drug coverage. 


