

Q1 In the upcoming June provincial election, what do you consider to be the most important issue:





Q2 Thinking about health care, what do you consider to be the most important TWO issues?





Q3 How would you rate the overall quality of health services in Ontario? (1 is poor, 5 is excellent)





Q4 Have you or a loved one tried to access a family doctor in the past year?





Q5 You indicated that you or a loved one tried to access a family doctor in the past year. How quickly were you or your loved one seen?





Q6 Please tell us, how concerned are you with the time it takes to get access to diagnostic procedures like MRIs and CT scans?









Q9 You indicated that you or a loved one tried to access home care in the past year. How quickly were you or your loved one seen at home?





Q10 Have you or a loved one applied for long-term care in the past year?







Q12 Thinking of your children, or children you know, do you think they will have better, worse or the same access to health care in the future than you do?








